UHSP's Grace Beyer on Pace to Break NAIA All-Time Scoring Record Tomorrow

Beyer is just 14 points away from the current NAIA record of 3,855 points

WHO: Grace Beyer, point guard for the University of Health Sciences and Pharmacy in St. Louis

Eutectics Women's Basketball team

WHAT: Grace Beyer expected to break National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics' all-time

scoring record for women's basketball

WHEN: Saturday, Feb. 24; Game time: 1 p.m. vs. Hannibal-LaGrange

WHERE: University of Health Sciences and Pharmacy in St. Louis' competition gym, located on the first floor of the University's Recreation and Student Center.

SIGNIFICANCE: Grace Beyer, point guard for the UHSP Eutectics Women's Basketball team, is just 14 points away from making history as she chases the NAIA's all-time scoring record for women's basketball. Beyer will play her final regular season game at home tomorrow, where she's expected to break the current NAIA record of 3,855 points, currently held by Miriam Walker-Samuels, who played for Claflin University from 1987-90. Beyer's point total currently stands at 3,841.

Members of the media are invited to attend tomorrow's game to witness history as Beyer makes her run for the record books.
